### A Baptism service

Parents and Godparents make important promises

Attend one of our Church services beforehand so we can offer you a warm welcome

Complete one Baptism preparation evening where the promises are explained

A celebration including prayers AND water

If I choose a Baptism service, what happens now? Read on...



In the Church of England, baptism (also known as christening) marks the beginning of a journey with God. Candidates are welcomed into the Church family and make promises to follow Jesus. Of course, babies and little children are too young to make these decisions for themselves, so parents and godparents make these promises on their child's behalf.



#### Parents and godparents should be prepared to make these promises:

Will you support this child as they begin their journey of faith? **We will.** Will you help this child to live and grow within God's family? **We will.** Will you pray for them and help them to follow Christ? **We will.** 

We all wander far from God and lose our way. Christ comes to find us and welcomes us home. In baptism we respond to his call.

Do you turn away from sin? I do.

Do you reject evil? I do.

Do you turn to Christ as Saviour? I do.

Do you trust him as Lord? I do.

To be as ready as possible for the big day, we ask that you:

#### Attend one of our services:

The details of our services are found on the back of this booklet. At the end of the service, one of our Baptism co-ordinators will help you book a date for your child's baptism and invite you to a preparation evening.

#### **Choose your godparents:**

It's normal for children to have 3 godparents who will commit to helping your child live and grow within God's family. They must have been baptised themselves.

#### Attend a Baptism preparation evening:

These normally take place on the first Monday of the month at 7.30pm and last for about an hour. The evening offers a relaxed opportunity for parents and godparents to meet the clergy and any other baptism families. There will be time to discuss the service, answer any questions and pray for your child.

Baptisms are free services in the Church of England. There is **no** charge. However, there is an opportunity after the service for you and your guests to donate to the church if you wish. We are a charity and appreciate any donation, no matter how small or large.
